
HISTORY

Yanney's Kids was established in 1989 by Dr. Gail and Mike Yanney, (later called All Our Kids), a mentoring program for middle school students in the Omaha area.

In 1996, Jerry and Cookie Hoberman sought to celebrate the achievements of Belvedere Elementary School students, and what began as an adopt-a-school relationship evolved into the Winners Circle achievement program.

In 2007, Winners Circle and All Our Kids were married, forming Partnership 4 Kids.

Philanthropists and community leaders, Dick and Mary Holland were responsible for precipitating the union, recognizing the potential to seamlessly walk a child from pre-kindergarten through high school.



HOW WE DO IT

WE WORK EXCLUSIVELY IN TITLE 1, OMAHA PUBLIC SCHOOLS

- Programming spans pre-kindergarten through postsecondary.
- Elementary programming (literacy/goal setting) is executed in the classroom during the school day.
- Our middle and high school mentoring program is hosted after school, is <u>curriculum-driven</u> and lead by P4K program coordinators and community mentors.
- Program success is heavily influenced by collaboration with businesses, community volunteers, other youth organizations, non-profits and colleges and universities.




