ELEMENTARY PROGRAM

In our **Elementary Program**, students from Pre-K through 4th grade participate in the Book Buddy program to strengthen literacy skills and develop a lifelong love of reading. In 5th and 6th grade, students participate with Goal Buddies, where they work in a small-group setting with mentors to set and achieve goals focused on literacy, life skills, and school attendance. Curriculum introduces students to careers and postsecondary educational options. These early experiences build confidence and create a foundation for success in later years.

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

Our **Middle School Program** serves 7th and 8th graders, helping students continue to build strong study habits, explore career interests, and learn what it takes to prepare for high school and beyond. Through group mentoring, hands-on learning activities, and goal setting, students strengthen their academic and personal development while discovering what they're capable of achieving.

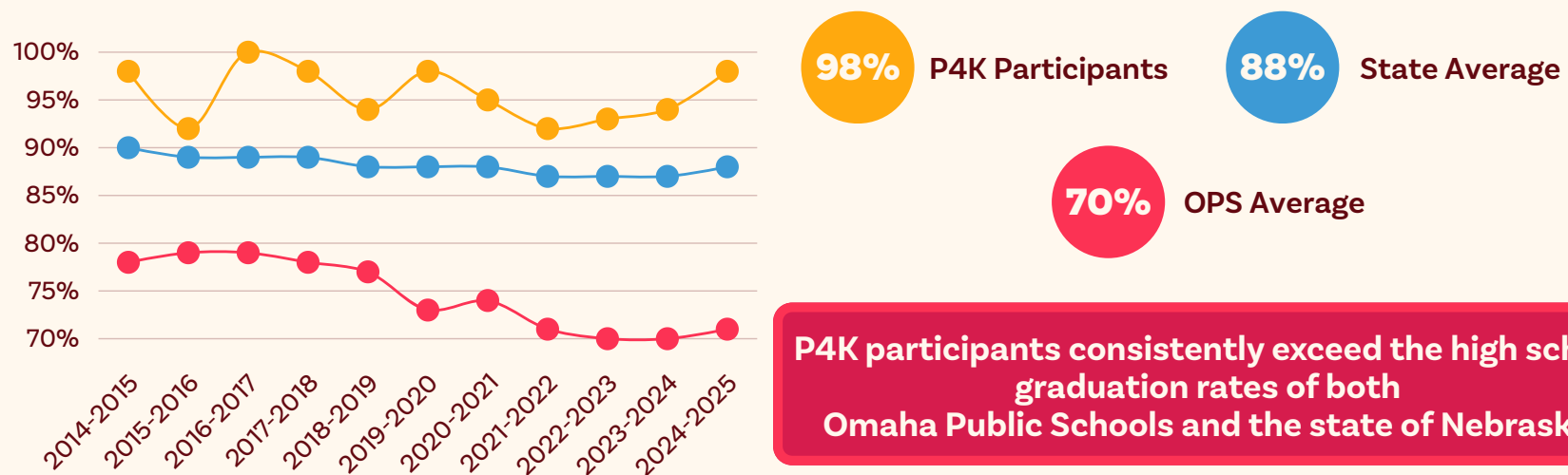
HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

Our **High School Program** supports students in 9th through 12th grade as they set long-term goals, explore career pathways, and prepare for life after graduation. With consistent mentor support, college and career readiness workshops, and opportunities to visit local campuses and businesses, students gain the confidence and tools they need to transition successfully into postsecondary education or the workforce.

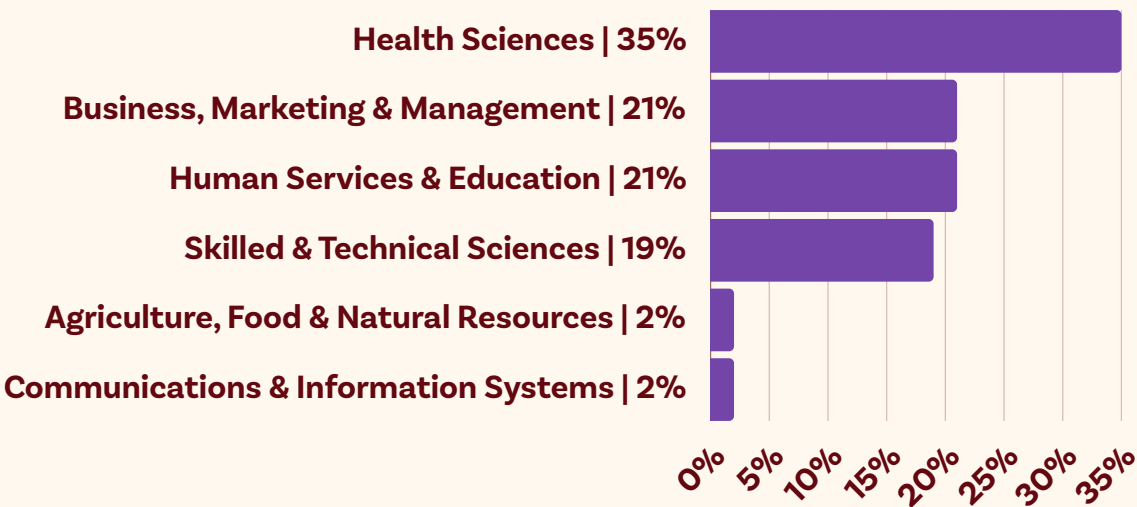

HOW WE DO IT

WE WORK EXCLUSIVELY IN TITLE 1, OMAHA PUBLIC SCHOOLS

- Programming encompasses all levels, from pre-k to postsecondary.
- Elementary programming - focused on literacy, attendance and goal setting for every student - takes place in the classroom during school day.
- Our middle and high school mentoring program features a structured curriculum led by P4K program coordinators in partnership with community mentors during after-school sessions.
- The success of the program is significantly enhanced through collaboration with businesses, community volunteers, other youth organizations, non-profits, and institutions of higher education.

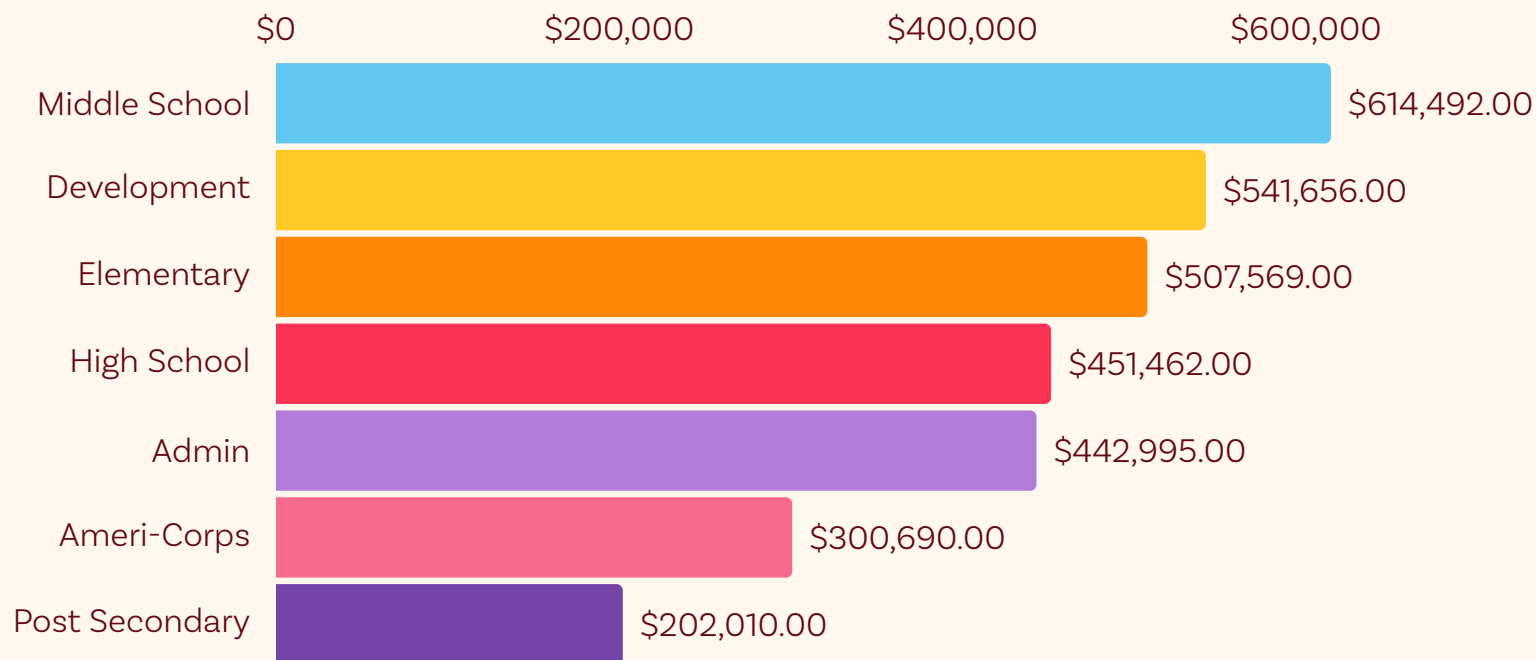

The majority of expenses are directed toward staff who implement programming while also serving as mentors.

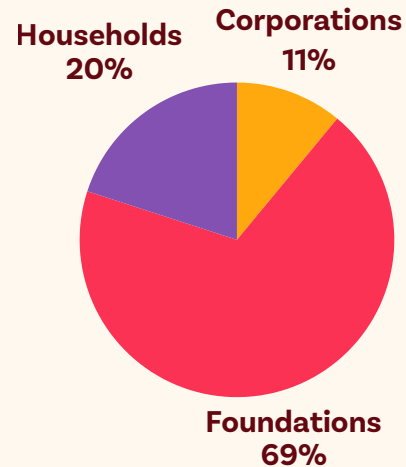
AGENCY BUDGET

\$3,060,874

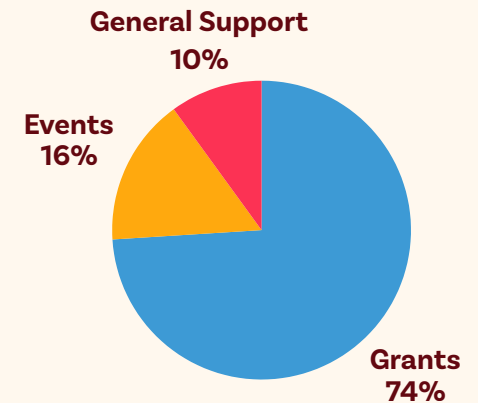
P4K invests over \$3M dollars annually into the education and support of 2,400 youth from low-income communities in Northeast and Southeast Omaha. An additional \$287,989 from our foundation is invested in postsecondary scholarships for P4K students attending a certificate, 2-year or 4-year program.
